Course Description

This course is a hybrid course with 2 face-to-face online (Synchronous) and 1 online (Asynchronous) sessions. To access the course, please visit Canvas.rutgers.edu. This course is designed to give basic knowledge of Hindi to beginners with no prior knowledge of the language. Building upon gradual learning of Hindi vocabulary and script, this course situates Hindi in its socio-cultural context. Along with reading and writing, students will be exposed to contextualized use of Hindi. Instructional methods are specially designed for this purpose and will heighten awareness of South Asian culture. Class lectures will be frequently supplemented by Internet and audio-visual materials from South Asia. Learning strategies will involve active student participation through classroom exercises in Hindi. Practice in listening and comprehending Hindi will also be provided with basic grammar integrated in the learning process. Grammar will be strongly emphasized. However, grammar instructions will not only focus on mechanical drills, but will be used support and compliment real life communication, such as identification/descriptions of self and peoples, place, weather, shopping, making transaction, giving directions, taking a rickshaw/taxi, etc.

Course requirements:

This is a 4-credit hybrid course. Therefore, you are expected to engage with course content for 10 to 12 hours each week including: 4 hours of class and 6-8 hours of readings, watching or listening to audios/videos content, weekly assignments, quizzes, presentation and face-to-face meetings.

Every week, you will need to read the grammar lessons/chapters or watch/listen to the audiovisual files posted for that week. Based on those materials, you will complete grammar exercises, comprehension questions, write composition, do translations, To target listening and speaking skills, you will produce audio/video recorded conversation, role-plays, or skits. You will be expected to incorporate new vocabulary and grammar, acquired from the posted materials into your own sentences.

For the face-to-face portion, you must attend meetings for two hours each week. These meetings will be used to assess your speaking, review complex grammar structures, and practice speaking comprehension skills. If you need additional help, you are encouraged to make an appointment during my online office hours.

Since the instruction will be held online, you will be required to log in to Canvas for all assignments, which will create an electronic record of all participation in the class.
